Citizens Financial Group has adopted a [Statement on Advocacy and Political Activities](#) under which Citizens will disclose, on a semiannual basis, certain advocacy and political expenditures, consistent with our commitment to transparency.

Citizens does not make corporate contributions to political candidates or committees and does not expect to make other corporate political expenditures, as detailed in the Statement on Advocacy and Political Activities. If any such expenditures are made, however, Citizens will disclose them here.

Citizens confirms that the requirements of the Statement on Advocacy and Political Activities as well as the Citizens Code of Business Conduct and Ethics, the Political Contributions Policy, and the Government Relations Standard Operating Procedures, were followed in the making of these contributions, and all contributions by Citizens and the Citizens PACs are the subject of legal and compliance review.

### **Corporate Political Contributions and Expenditures**

No corporate political contributions or expenditures were made during the semiannual period.

### **Other Corporate Contributions**

In connection with ceremonies marking gubernatorial inaugurations in two states within our footprint, Citizens made corporate contributions to the following inaugural committees:

- The Governor Dan McKee Inaugural Committee (501(c)(4) organization), \$25,000, 1/3/23
- Healey Driscoll Inaugural Committee (segregated account under state law), \$10,000, 1/5/23
- Friends of Andrea Campbell Inaugural Committee (segregated account under state law), \$5,000, 1/18/23

### **Political Action Committee Contributions**

Citizens sponsors two Political Action Committees (PACs), supported by the voluntary contributions of Citizens colleagues. The Citizens PACs make bipartisan campaign contributions in compliance with local, state, and federal election laws.
